“Can’t you just put my calendar in the middle of the page?”

- ▶ These plugins address layout limitations on themes that you can’t change without doing a lot of coding for things like padding, margins, etc.
- ▶ RE: permanence - Nothing in core to address these layout limitations yet. Greg Priddy (Page Builder creator): “I was at a small WordPress meetup in Cape Town and spoke to Matt about a page/content builder for WordPress. He gave a rough guess of WordPress 3.9 being the time when they’d look at including drag and drop Page Builder functionality in the core. That would still be over a year off given the current release cycle.” (May 2013)
- ▶ Widgetize Pages and Page Builder allow users to easily drop sidebar items into pages, posts & other theme locations, or even create rows and columns and build all the main site content entirely out of widgets.

Widgetize Pages Plugin

- ▶ Plugin Author: OTWthemes (codecanyon.net)
- ▶ Available since October 2012
- ▶ Both free version and full version; the full version retails for \$20 single use; extended license is \$100.
- ▶ Free version is ideal for isolated widget drop-in when you already have most column issues worked out. Full version has many more options, even allowing one to manage ALL sidebars, create both vertical & horizontal columns, and good integration with a number of other plugins such as WPML, WooCommerce & BuddyPress.
- ▶ Ajax-based. "Fits well into core." Not currently in core, however.

Page Builder Plugin

- ▶ by Site Origin – Greg Priddy <http://siteorigin.com/page-builder/>
- ▶ First available to public in the middle of April 2013; same approx. number of downloads to date as Widgetize Pages. Free. Also free widget inclusion.
- ▶ Drag & Drop, easy column creation
- ▶ User doesn't need to work with shortcodes even
- ▶ Grid Engine: The CSS generated by Grid Engine is up to 10-50 times lighter than typical CSS grid systems. The CSS is inline style. Heavy Javascript.
- ▶ Very active current development and support.

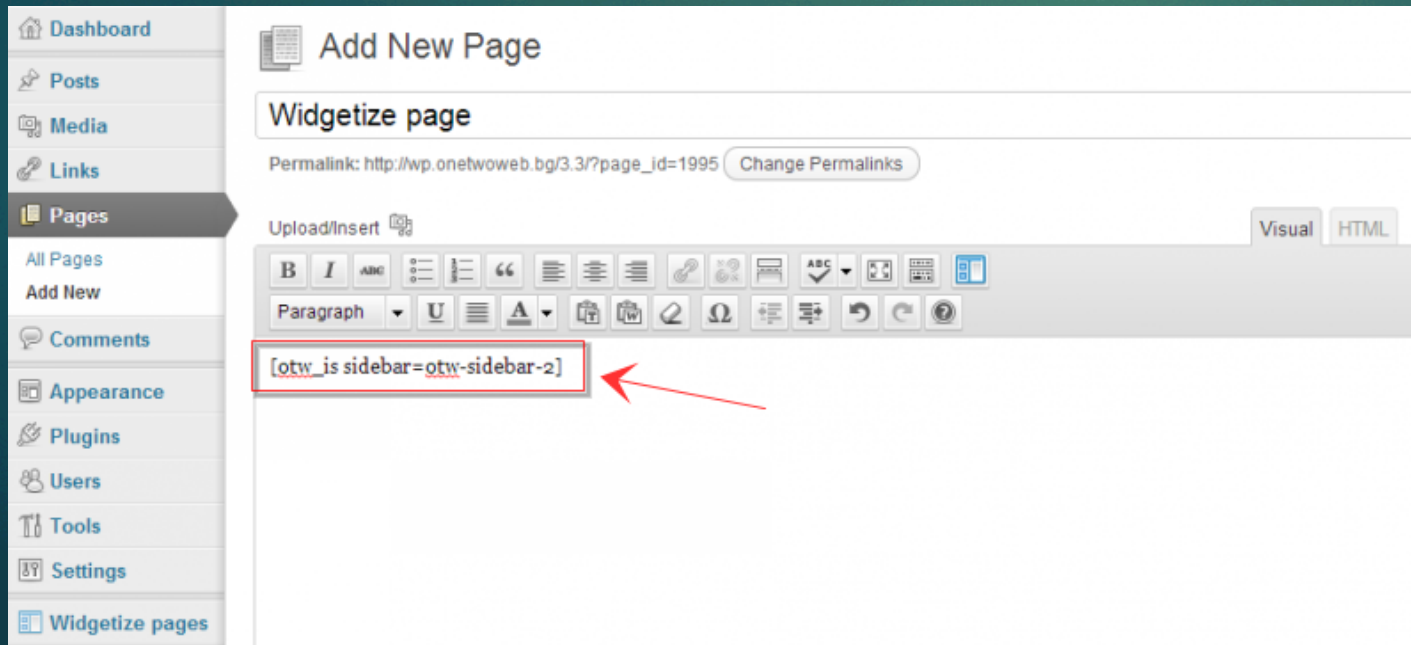
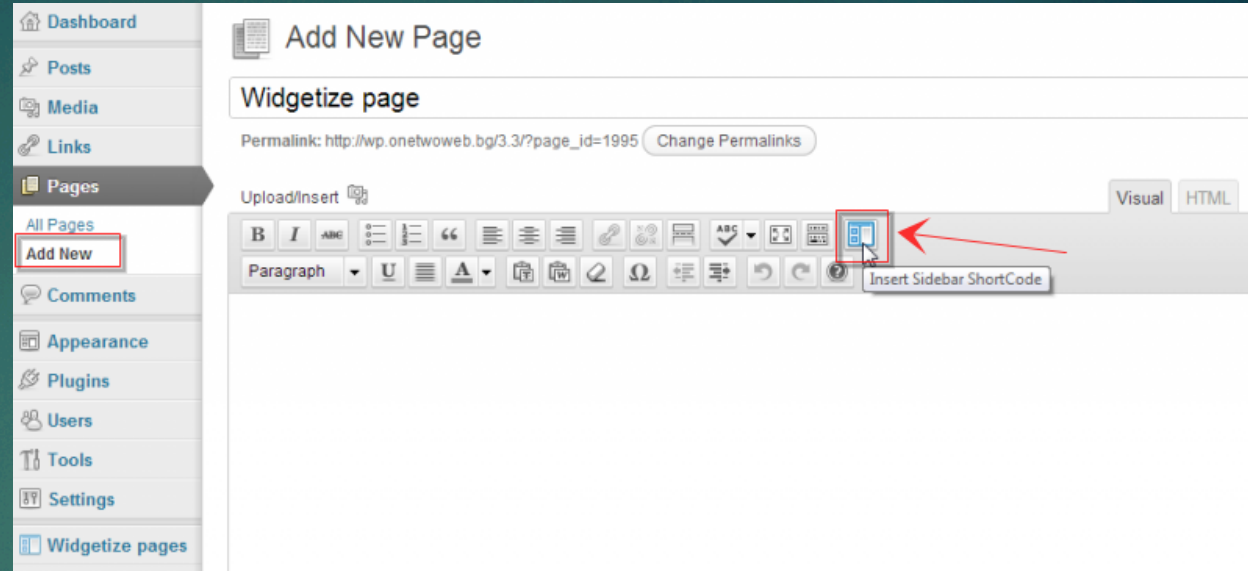

Use the shortcode feature to add a sidebar in your pages/posts. Shortcodes can be added in:

- page/post content - copy the shortcode and paste it in the editor of a page/post
- any page template using the do_shortcode WP function.

Use the Sidebar ID to build your shortcodes.
Example: `[otw_is sidebar=otw-sidebar-1]`

Widgetize Pages: Styling & Columns

- ▶ Styling the new sidebar widgets – need to know code to do this.
- ▶ Each sidebar has its own class, or they can all be styled via the main tag (otw-sidebar)
- ▶ For individual styling use:
 - .otw-sidebar-1 for the whole sidebar
 - .otw-sidebar-1 h2.widgettitle for the headings
 - .otw-side-bar .widget for the individual widgets.
- ▶ No column creation/management included in free version.

Deeper integration

- ▶ If you want to insert the sidebar in the **page content editor**, paste the shortcode there.
- ▶ If you want to insert it **in a template file of your theme** use the `do_shortcode` WordPress function

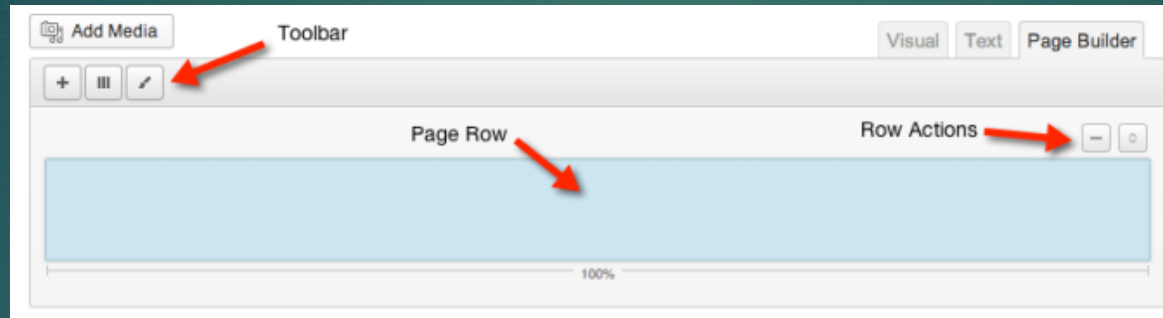
- ▶ Example:

```
[otw_is sidebar=otw-sidebar-1]
```

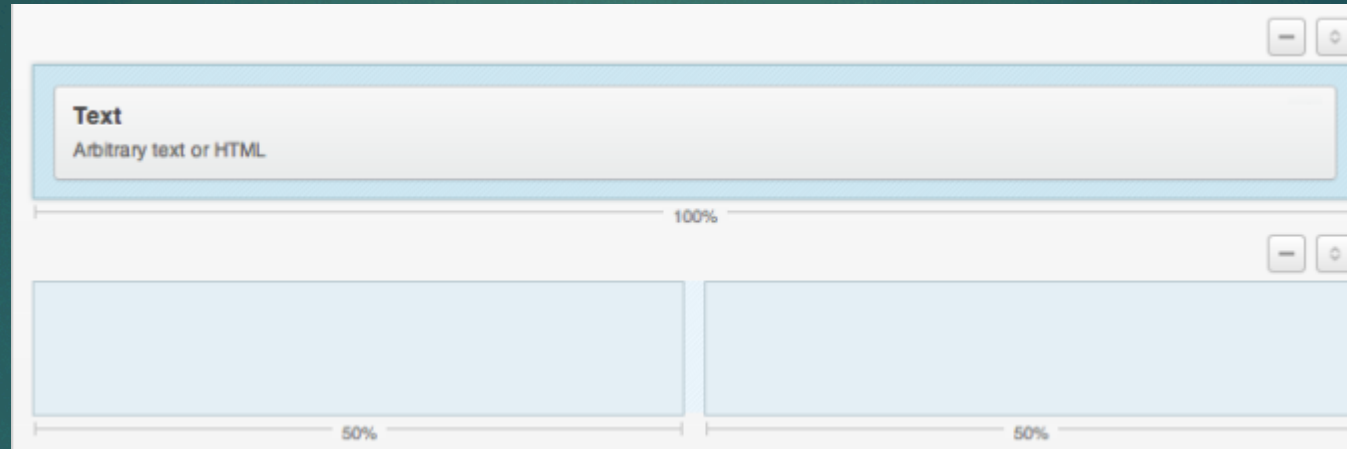

Page Builder: How to.

- ▶ Install Plugin. Open content editor – 3rd tab is Page Builder



- ▶ To add a new row of columns, click on the add columns button (3 upright bars). You can choose how many columns you want in your new row.
- ▶ Widgets form the building blocks of your pages. Click on the add widget button (plus icon) in the toolbar to bring up the widget selection interface.
- ▶ Can also load preexisting layouts as a starting point – supplied either by theme or by cloning your own page layouts built with Page Builder.

Insert widget; drag & drop. Boom.



Styling: Follows theme specs.

Integrates with: Black Studio TinyMCE (WYSWYG), translation-ready

Includes: various self-hosted widgets, ie, video player

Points of interest

Widgetize Pages

- ▶ Does not integrate with theme styles. Custom individual and universal sidebar styling possible using coding.
- ▶ Copying layout more circuitous
- ▶ Free, simple version ideal for single-instance use.
- ▶ Has been around longer

Page Builder

- ▶ Adopts current theme styles. Can customize if desired via CSS.
- ▶ Easy to clone layouts
- ▶ Ideal for clients who want something like the Wix setup on Wordpress
- ▶ Responsive
- ▶ More recent; more popular
